#### 1. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE TO THE FLAG

Vice-President Dave Loeffler called the November 6, 2017 regular meeting of the governing body to order at 7:00 p.m. and led the pledge to the flag.

# 2. OCTOBER 2, 2017 MINUTES

a) Councilwoman Loeffler made the <u>motion</u> to approve the October 2, 2017 Minutes, Councilman Thomas seconded and the motion passed 4-0.

#### 3. PUBLIC COMMENTS

a) Lt Nicole Palmer of the PA State Police attended meeting to introduce herself and give a report of Borough activities that have been reported. One of the services offered by the State Police are house checks, if a resident will be leaving for some period of time they may contact the department and the police will do periodical house checks for them.

### 4. SOLICITOR'S REPORT

- a) 49 York Street Variance Appeal Decision from Judge was received and the ruling was against the Borough's Appeal. Discussion on options available and councils' concerns for residents complying to the borough ordinances. Councilman Thoman made the **motion** to take no further action against the appeal, Councilman Thomas seconded and the vote was 2-2, Vice President Loeffler and Councilwoman Loeffler voted nay. Mayor Sanders voted to break the tie with a nay vote, motion failed. Councilwoman Loeffler made the **motion** to approve to have the solicitor to proceed and file an appeal of the decision of the Court of Common Pleas of York County, Vice President Loeffler seconded and the motion passed 3-1, Councilman Thoman voted nay.
- b) Refuse & Recycling 2018, Contract Bid Two bids were received by Solicitor from Penn Waste, Inc. and Republic Services of Pennsylvania, LLC. Bids were reviewed by council and lowest bid was chosen. Councilwoman Loeffler made the **motion** to accept the bid from Penn Waste, Inc. for Jefferson Borough's refuse and recycling hauler for 2018, 2019, 2020, Councilman Thomas seconded and the motion passed 4-0.
- c) Ordinance No. 2017-06 (No Parking) Engineer did a draft for the traffic study to be reviewed. Council accepted the study and Engineer Toms will issue a final report for next meeting. We will wait to advertise No Parking Ordinance at the same time we advertise for a Ticketing Ordinance which the solicitor is working to provide for council.
- d) 6 Highland Avenue Right-of-Way Violation Solicitor sent enforcement notice to Mr. & Mrs. Kesecker with the information of the ordinance violation and requirement to comply within 30 days of date on notice. Councilman Thoman made the **motion** to approve the solicitor to file a complaint with the District Magistrate Judge if the Kesecker's have not complied within the 30 days to the notice, Councilwoman Loeffler seconded and the motion passed 4-0.

e) Gaming Expansion – Municipal Opt-Out Resolution. Councilman Thoman made a <u>motion</u> to have the solicitor do a Resolution for the Municipal Opt-Out Gaming Expansion, Councilwoman Loeffler seconded and motion passed 4-0.

#### 5. ENGINEER'S REPORT

- a) 2018 Street Improvements Council discussed the options that Engineer Toms presented for funding the borough 2018 Street Improvement Projects. Council was in agreement to do the E. Sunset View Storm Drainage and E. Sunset View Street work. The fund option that was chosen would be to use the Liquid Fuels that the borough currently is holding in the bank and the balance of the work would be using PIB Loan which is borrowing against the borough's future liquid fuels allocation at a lower interest rate.
- b) Building Windows Engineer will get information together for Bidding Specs for replacement of the borough building windows.

- b) 2018 Budget Budget was not advertised after previous meeting because of the need to shift funds from Miscellaneous Expenses to the Reserve Account. Councilman Thomas made the **motion** to advertise the 2018 Budget, Councilman Thoman seconded and motion passed 4-0.

Councilman Thoman made the <u>motion</u> to accept President Stauffer's request, Councilman Thomas seconded and the motion passed 3-0 and Vice President Loeffler abstained.
- b) Borough Council Meetings for 2018 Councilman Thoman made the **motion** to advertise the Borough Council Meeting schedule for 2018, Councilwoman Loeffler seconded and the motion passed 4-0.
- c) Zoning Hearing Board Appointment Term for Tom Baum expires at the end of 2017. The Borough received two appointment requests which were from borough residents, Tom Baum and Conrad Eiben. Conrad Eiben was in attendance and made a request in person for consideration for the appointment to the Zoning Hearing Board. He then left the meeting. Councilman Thoman made the **motion** to appoint Tom Baum for the three-year term to the Zoning Hearing Board, Councilman Thomas seconded and a vote was taken, two yes votes and two nay votes. The nay votes were Councilwoman Loeffler and Vice President Loeffler. Mayor Sanders voted to break the tie with a nay vote. Motion failed. Vice President Loeffler made the **motion** to appoint Conrad Eiben to the three-year term to the Zoning Hearing Board, Councilwoman Loeffler seconded and a vote was taken, two yes votes and two nay votes. The nay votes were Councilman Thomas and Councilman Thoman. Mayor Sanders voted to break the tie with a yes vote. Motion passed.
- d) SEK&Co Auditor's Engagement Letter for 2017, 2018 and 2019. Councilwoman Loeffler made the <u>motion</u> to accept Smith Elliott Kearns & Company, LLC Auditor's Engagement Letter, Councilman Thomas seconded and the motion passed 4-0.
- e) Hersh Concepts 2018-2019 Mowing Contract. Vice President Loeffler made the <u>motion</u> to accept the mowing contract from Hersh Concepts for 2018 and 2019, Councilman Thoman seconded and the motion passed 4-0.
- f) Brokenshire Snow Removal 2018 Contract. Councilman Thoman made the **motion** to accept the 2018 Snow Removal Contract from Fred Brokenshire, Councilwoman Loeffler seconded and the motion passed 4-0.

- g) Fitzpatrick Lot Rental New Contract beginning 2018. Councilman Thoman made the **motion** to approve the new lot rental contract with Sandra Fitzpatrick with the understanding that the driveway entrance on Cherry Street needs to remain open, Councilwoman Loeffler seconded and the motion passed 4-0.
